## 2) WATER RATES - WATER RELIABILITY CHARGE

- Staff is requesting City Council input on the water reliability charge.
- Liaison discussed points from the September 13 Public Works Commission Meeting. The Commission recommended staff to develop rate options without a General Fund loan.
- Different water reliability charge rate options were presented and reviewed. Each scenario
  has funding options including, revenue bonds, General Fund loans, and General Fund
  contributions.
- In all four rate scenarios, Inside City customers would receive a subsidy due to a \$10 million General Fund contribution. Outside City rates would not receive a subsidy. The Mayor mentioned to the West Hollywood staff, that if they wanted to contribute towards the water reliability project(s) then the West Hollywood customers too may receive a subsidy.
- Additional rate scenarios were requested which minimized initial bill impacts, had minimal
  incremental increases/decreases, and, if possible, minimized the differential between
  inside and outside City customers.
- The revised rate options would be reviewed by the Water Rates Ad Hoc Committee.
